

Post Doctoral Fellowship

Description: Depending on skill level and experience post docs will receive intensive trauma training in research based interventions, including Trauma Focused-Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (TF-CBT) as well as some Parent-Child Interaction Therapy (PCIT) and the Circle of Security Parenting Program. Post Docs will provide trauma therapy to children ages 3-18 and their parents/families. Post Docs will carry a case load of 10-15 children depending on comfort level and training goals. Post Docs will also help conduct and supervise psychological consults, psychological testing and risk assessment evaluations. Post Docs will work closely with the center's clinical psychologists who provide weekly individual supervision and group supervision. Post Docs will have leadership opportunities such as supervising practicum students, leading didactics and co-leading group supervision. Post Docs will attend weekly multidisciplinary case conferences which include our partner agency representatives from Child Welfare Services, Family Crimes Division of the Police, Office of the State's Attorney and Office of the County Attorney. Opportunities to conduct group therapy with non offending parents and to observe forensic interviews are available depending on interest.

Time Requirement: Post Doctoral fellows typically begin July 1st and remain through the end of June the following year. 40 hours a week is preferred. The deadline for applications is March 15th for the upcoming July. We accept applications on a rolling basis and on occasion are able to accept students during the semester or mid year.

Qualifications: Applicants must have attended an APA Accredited Clinical or Counseling Doctoral Psychology Program and attended or be attending an APA Accredited internship with expected completion before the beginning of the fellowship. Training and course work in child and adolescent development and clinical psychology is required as well as demonstration of significant expertise in evidence based therapy and assessment.
